# Flip Book for:

Congratulations! Your child is ready for a CVC flip book. This is one of the first steps in learning to read. Here is how to use this flip book:

1. Practice all the time. Let your child read to you while you cook dinner, before a bed time story, any time you have a moment.
2. **VERY IMPORTANT:** we are at the level of looking at a word and sounding it out. If it **SOUNDS** like a real word then it **IS** a real word. For example “rox” sounds out correctly as “rocks”. This is not the time to correct your child with, “Well, actually that is not a real word because rocks is supposed to be spelled with a cks, not an x.”
3. Real words vs. silly words. The goal of this stage of reading is for kids to be able to sound out the letters correctly and string them together to make a word. You can have your child sound out three random letters in this book and then ask, “Is that a real word or a silly word?” As long as the letters were strung together successfully the goal was met. This also prepares kids for when they come to large words that they don’t instantly know, like scientific words in non fiction text.
